




Men's Breakfast July 5th-Cancelled

Habitat for Humanity



Construction volunteers can be anybody. You can know how to use a power saw, drill, hammer, or you can help carry lumber, paint, sweep the site to help keep it tidy, put up window blinds, or help set up for lunch. Any skill level is welcome. And if you want, the more experienced volunteers will teach you how to do the more skilled jobs. The site leaders will fit you into what you are comfortable doing or what you want to do. Tools and safety equipment are provided.

Volunteers work on Saturdays, from 8:30am - 2:00 or 3:00pm with lunch provided. You can come as seldom or as often as you wish. This isn't a binding commitment. But we have found as soon as someone tries it, the majority keep coming back because it is fun, rewarding, and a purposeful way to spend a few hours helping families in need of new housing. And you meet new friends. And you get cool t-shirts!

What is the Summer Meals Program?

The Summer Meals Program began at Faith in 2012 as a government supported program. The restrictions were such that after struggling with them for several years, we formed a partnership with Snack in a Backpack to provide food to needy children and families during the 8 weeks of summer vacation. Fannin Family Connections, Feed Fannin, and St. Luke's also participate in this effort. The program is now fully funded by contributions, receiving no government funding. Our mission budget is contributing \$3000 to the program this year. Starting June 5th, we began delivering food each week to around 450 children and 170 families. Each child receives enough food for several meals each week. These are the children who receive free or reduced cost lunches during the school year. We deliver to Blue Ridge Housing, Brookstone, Brooks Summit, Laurelwood Apartments, LaVista Apartments, McCaysville Housing Authority, and Mineral Springs Apartments. Open Arms, the Recreation Center, and Milestones Preschool also receive food. Volunteers are still needed for packing and delivery.
